## WELCOME ADDRESS BY MR LIM SIONG GUAN CHAIRMAN OF HONOUR (SINGAPORE) DURING THE LAUNCH OF HONOUR (SINGAPORE) ON 5 AUGUST 2014

Mr Heng Swee Keat, Minister for Education,

Ladies and Gentlemen.

A warm welcome to the launch of Honour (Singapore). Thank you everyone for joining us in this celebration of hope and affirmation for Singapore. Your presence this evening is so very encouraging. We hope you will find the event both inspiring and worthy of your time and support.

We believe that being a people of honour, whose word can be trusted, who can be relied on to deliver on our promises, is the most basic reason for Singapore's success all these years. Nothing else can explain why so many foreign investors should place their money in Singapore. And all will be lost for Singapore if this virtue of honour and trustworthiness, which makes us stand out among the nations, is forgotten along the way.



Honour (Singapore) expects to engage a broad spectrum of Singapore society - schools, families, businesses, workplaces and community groups - through talks, conferences, and other events, to spread the message that a culture of honour and honouring is fundamental for success in many aspects of life. We expect to conduct various engagement programmes on applying honour in daily living, namely, "Leading with Honour," "Living with Honour," "Loving with Honour," and "Learning with Honour."

It is very much a privilege for us this evening to have Mr Heng Swee Keat, Minister for Education and Minister in charge of the SG50 celebrations, as our guest of honour. We look forward to his wise counsel and encouragement.
